Parsha in a Nutshell

The name of the Parshah, “Matot,” means “Tribes,” and it is found in Bamidbar 30:2. The name of the Parshah, “Masei,” means “Journeys,” and it is found in Bamidbar 33:1.

Moshe conveys the laws governing the annulment of nedarim (vows) to the heads of the Shevatim of Bnei Yisrael. War is waged against Midian for its role in plotting the moral destruction of Bnei Yisrael, and the Torah gives a detailed account of the spoils of war and how they are allocated among the people, the warriors, the Leviim, and the Kohen Gadol.

The Shevatim of Reuven and Gad—later joined by half the tribe of Menashe—request the lands east of the Yarden as their inheritance in Eretz Yisrael, since the region is ideal pastureland for their livestock. Moshe is initially angered by the request, but later agrees on the condition that they first join—and lead—the conquest of the lands west of the Yarden.

The forty-two masa'ot (journeys) and encampments of the Bnei Yisrael are listed, from the Yetziat Mitzrayim to their encampment on the plains of Moav, across the Yarden from Eretz Canaan. The boundaries of Eretz Yisrael are defined, and the Arei Miklat (Cities of Refuge) are designated as places of refuge and exile for those guilty of unintentional manslaughter. The daughters of Tzelafchad marry within their own tribe of Menashe, ensuring that the inheritance they receive from their father remains within their shevet.

Frankists Defeated (1759)

The **Frankist** sect, founded by the false messiah **Yaakov Frank**, sought to blend Judaism with Christianity. In a public debate in **Lvov**, the **Baal Shem Tov**, **Rabbi Chaim Rappaport**, and **Rabbi Yitzchak Dov Ber Margulies** decisively refuted the sect's teachings, and the day was established as one of thanksgiving.

Sunday

Third Expulsion from France (1322)

King Charles IV expelled the Jews from France, breaking an earlier royal pledge allowing them to remain in the country after their previous expulsion.

Monday

Passing of the Yismach Moshe (1841)

Rabbi Moshe Teitelbaum, author of **Yismach Moshe** and patriarch of many Hungarian Chassidic dynasties, passed away.

Passing of Rabbi Shlomo Ganzfried (1886)

Rabbi Shlomo Ganzfried, author of the **Kitzur Shulchan Aruch**, passed away. His concise guide to practical halachah remains one of the most widely studied Jewish law texts.

Tuesday

Passing of Rashi (1105)

Rashi (Rabbi Shlomo Yitzchaki) passed away. His commentaries on **Tanach** and the **Gemara** remain the foundation of Torah study for students and scholars alike.

Wednesday

Passing of Aharon HaKohen (1274 BCE)

Aharon HaKohen, brother of **Moshe Rabbeinu** and **Miriam**, passed away at age 123. His **yahrtzeit**, on **1 Av**, is the only one explicitly recorded in the **Torah**.

Ezra HaSofer Arrives in Eretz Yisrael (348 BCE)

Ezra HaSofer and his followers arrived from **Bavel** to strengthen Jewish life around the newly rebuilt **Second Beit HaMikdash**.

Thursday

Vel' d'Hiv Roundup (1942)

Over 13,000 Jews in Paris were arrested by French police and confined in the **Vel' d'Hiv** stadium before being deported to **Auschwitz**, where most were murdered.

Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak Schneersohn Visits Eretz Yisrael (1929)

The sixth **Lubavitcher Rebbe**, **Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak Schneersohn**, completed his historic visit to **Eretz Yisrael**, praying at many holy sites shortly before the tragic 1929 Arab massacres.

Passing of Rabbi Shimshon of Ostropoli (1648)

The renowned mekubal Rabbi Shimshon of Ostropoli was martyred during the Tach V'Tat massacres while wrapped in his tallit and tefillin. His profound Kabbalistic teachings continue to be studied.
